







SITE A: PEDESTRIAN WALKWAY

SAFE & CONVENIENT FOOT TRAFFIC.








- consider using reflective or green room to reduce the heat absorption since the area is getting direct afternoon sun.
- maximizing window opening on east side for morning sunlight and minimizing west facing windows to reduce heat gain.
- place plants and trees on west side to -provide natural shading during evening and reduction of heat build up on that side.



- Designing cross ventilation path allowing air to flow through.
- using buffers to weaker the off shore wind, creating a better path without blocking the on shore wind.
- placing dense vegetation on sides exposed to on shore wind when its too strong.
- building orientation narrower face towards the on shore wind to reduce the buildings exposure to strong winds.



- Emphasising the vies by adding glass walls or windows.
- adding **frosted glass** or other diffusing materials to let in light while obscuring views that are not visually appealing.
- Use landscaping features such as **trees**, **hedges**, **or planters** to create a natural screen around parts of the site that face unattractive views.
